#### NOTES ABOUT THE MUSIC & ART

For this Sixth Sunday of Epiphany, the choir is singing a spiritual at the offertory that may be unfamiliar to most people. *Rise, Shine* is the title and as with most spirituals in their original format, no composer is cited. Spirituals were an aural tradition and our choral library's version is so old that no arranger is cited either. While there is modern setting some may know, the choir will sing the older, more original version. At the communion, the choir sings *If Ye Love Me* by Thomas Tallis. This anthem relates to our readings of the day and was written during the short reign of Henry VIII's son, Edward VI (1547-1553). Tallis rode the political waves of four monarchs' reigns during great political upheaval, and avoided the violence which claimed Catholics and Protestants alike. *– Dr. Edward Maki-Schramm, Director of Music*
