ABOUT THE LITURGICAL ART

The altar flowers are given to the glory of God and in honor and memory of Salma Dib, who died on January 28th and was buried from the church this past Thursday, February 2nd. May Salma's soul and the souls of all the departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

The woodcut artwork on the bulletin cover is called *Let Your Light Shine*. It "reflects" today's Gospel, in which Jesus says, "Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." About it, the artist, the Rev. Cara B. Hochhalter, writes: "Perhaps we might let God's light be reflected in the ways we live and act in this world, knowing that it comes from a source within but also beyond ourselves." She adds, "In the image, I turned the block upside down to create a 'shadow' print. Once again, I was surprised at what appeared. There is an echo of the flame, in reverse, the candle itself. It is an inner light that is exactly what Jesus tells us not to hide. Perhaps finding his light inspires our own good works in the world, as we also look for it in others."
