OPENING GREETING

The Celebrant, facing the people and the persons to be married, with the woman to the right and the man to the left, addresses the congregation and says

Dearly beloved: We have come together in the presence of God to witness and bless the joining together of Marisa Sophiea and Alexander Blee in Holy Matrimony.

The joining of two people in a life of mutual fidelity signifies to us the mystery of the union between Christ and his Church, and so it is worthy of being honored among all people.

The union of two people in heart, body, and mind is intended by God for their mutual joy; for the help and comfort given one another in prosperity and adversity; and, when it is God's will, for the gift of children and their nurture in the knowledge and love of the Lord.

Therefore marriage is not to be entered into unadvisedly or lightly, but reverently, deliberately, and in accordance with the purposes for which it was instituted by God.

Into this holy union Alexander and Marisa now come to be joined. If any of you can show just cause why they may not lawfully be married, speak now; or else for ever hold your peace.

Then the Celebrant says to the persons to be married

I require and charge you both, here in the presence of God, that if either of you know any reason why you may not be united in marriage lawfully, and in accordance with God's Word, you do now confess it.

DECLARATION OF CONSENT

The Celebrant says to one member of the couple, then to the other

Celebrant Marisa, will you have this man to be your husband; to live together in the covenant of marriage? Will you love him, comfort him, honor and keep him, in sickness and in health; and, forsaking all others, be faithful to him as long as you both shall live?

answer I will.

- *Celebrant* Alexander, will you have this woman to be your wife; to live together in the covenant of marriage? Will you love her, comfort her, honor and keep her, in sickness and in health; and, forsaking all others, be faithful to her as long as you both shall live?
- answer I will.

The Celebrant then addresses the congregation, saying

Will all of you witnessing these promises do all in your power to uphold these two persons in their marriage?

People We will.

- People And also with you.

Let us pray.

O gracious and everliving God, you have created humankind in your image: Look mercifully upon Alexander and Marisa who come to you seeking your blessing, and assist them with your grace, that with true fidelity and steadfast love they may honor and keep the promises and vows they make; through Jesus Christ our Savior, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Having a Coke with You



Colossians 3:12-17 read by Aurelia Blee


Reader A reading from Colossians.

HOMILY

THE MARRIAGE

The couple comes before the assembly. The Celebrant then addresses the couple, saying

Celebrant Alexander and Marisa, you have come before God and the Church to make public your marriage to one another and to ask God's blessing.

Vows

The Man, facing the woman and taking her right hand in his, says

In the Name of God, I, Alexander, take you, Marisa, to be my wife, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better for worse, for richer for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, until we are parted by death. This is my solemn vow.

Then they loose their hands, and the Woman, still facing the man, takes his right hand in hers, and says

In the Name of God, I, Marisa, take you, Alexander, to be my husband, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better for worse, for richer for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, until we are parted by death. This is my solemn vow.

They loose their hands.

EXCHANGE OF RINGS

Celebrant **†**Bless, O Lord, these rings to be a sign of the vows by which Alexander and Marisa have bound themselves to each other; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The giver places the ring on the ring-finger of the other's hand and says

N., I give you this ring as a symbol of my vow, and with all that I am, and all that I have, I honor you, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.


PRONOUNCEMENT

Then the Celebrant joins the right hands of the husband and wife and says

Celebrant Now that Marisa and Alexander have given themselves to each other by solemn vows, with the joining of hands and the giving and receiving of a ring, I pronounce that they are wed to one another, in the †Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
Those whom God has joined together let no one put asunder.

People Amen.

All stand as able and sing.

LORD'S PRAYER

Let us pray together in the words our Savior taught us.

All Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Celebrant Let us pray.

Leader Eternal God, creator and preserver of all life, author of salvation, and giver of all grace: Look with favor upon the world you have made, and for which your Son gave his life, and especially upon Alexander and Marisa whom you make one flesh in Holy Matrimony.

All Amen.

Give them wisdom and devotion in the ordering of their common life, that each may be to the other a strength in need, a counselor in perplexity, a comfort in sorrow, and a companion in joy.

Amen.

Grant that their wills may be so knit together in your will, and their spirits in your Spirit, that they may grow in love and peace with you and one another all the days of their life.

Amen.

Give them grace, when they hurt each other, to recognize and acknowledge their fault, and to seek each other's forgiveness and yours.

Amen.

Make their life together a sign of Christ's love to this sinful and broken world, that unity may overcome estrangement, forgiveness heal guilt, and joy conquer despair.

Amen.

Bestow on them, if it is your will, the gift and heritage of children, and the grace to bring them up to know you, to love you, and to serve you.

Amen.

Give them such fulfillment of their mutual affection that they may reach out in love and concern for others.

Amen.

Grant that all married persons who have witnessed these vows may find their lives strengthened and their loyalties confirmed.

Amen.

The Celebrant continues, saying

O God, grant that the bonds of our common humanity, by which all your children are united one to another, and the living to the dead, may be so transformed by your grace, that your will may be done on earth as it is in heaven; where, O Father, with your Son, and the Holy Spirit, you live and reign in perfect unity, now and for ever. **Amen.**

BLESSING OF THE MARRIAGE

The people remain standing. The husband and wife kneel or bow their heads, as the Priest says

Celebrant	Most gracious God, we give you thanks
	for your tender love in sending Jesus Christ to come among us,
	to be born of a human mother,
	and to make the way of the cross to be the way of life.
	We thank you also for consecrating the union of man and woman in his Name.
	By the power of your Holy Spirit,
	pour out the abundance of your blessing upon Marisa and Alexander.
	Defend them from every enemy. Lead them into all peace.
	Let their love for each other be a seal upon their hearts,
	a mantle about their shoulders, and a crown upon their foreheads.
	Bless them in their work and in their companionship;
	in their sleeping and in their waking; in their joys and in their sorrows;
	in their life and in their death.
	Finally, in your mercy, bring them to that table
	where your saints feast for ever in your heavenly home;
	through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit
	lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever.
All	Amen.
	God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit,
	bless, preserve, and keep you;
	the Lord mercifully with his favor look upon you,
	and fill you with all spiritual benediction and grace;
	that you may faithfully live together in this life,
	and in the age to come have life everlasting.
